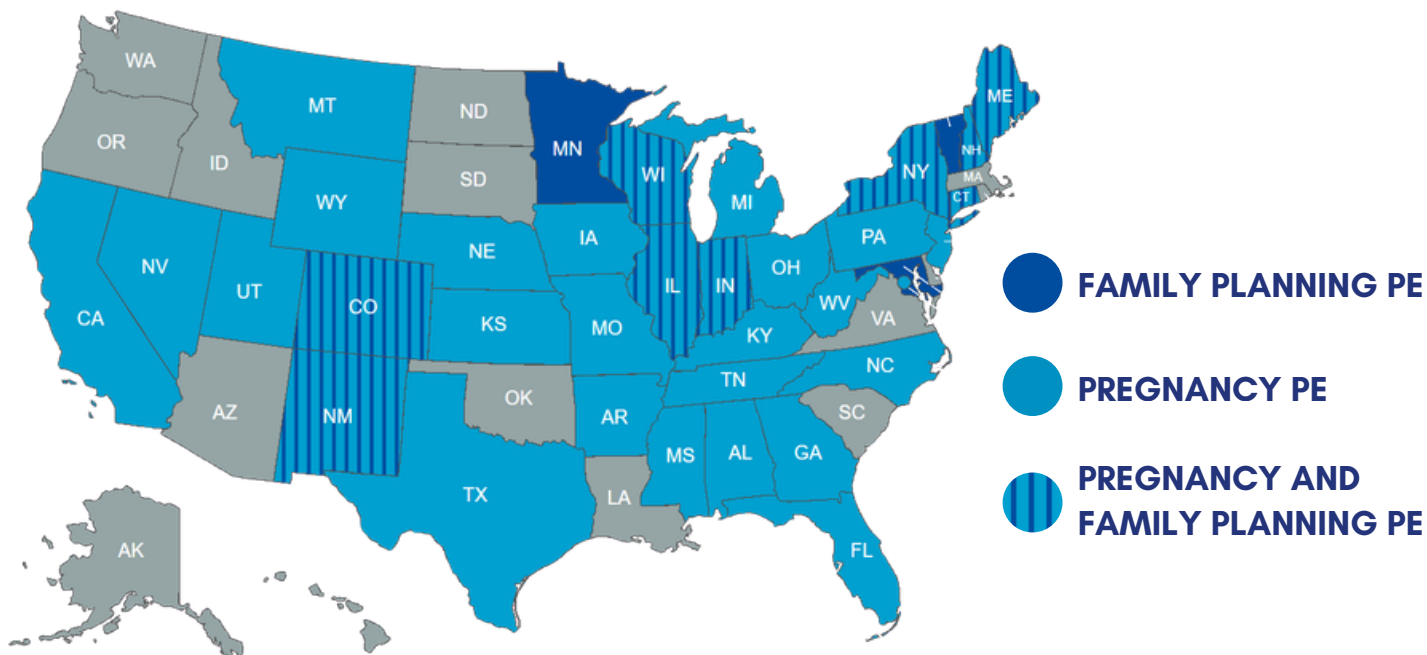

Family Planning Medicaid Presumptive Eligibility

Presumptive eligibility (PE) allows patients to access immediate, temporary Medicaid coverage for certain services by self-attesting to Medicaid eligibility with a qualified provider. Many states have PE for pregnancy Medicaid, but among states with Medicaid Family Planning Programs (MFPPs), Family Planning PE is underutilized



ADOPT FAMILY PLANNING PRESUMPTIVE ELIGIBILITY!

Family Planning PE improves access

- Family Planning PE covers the same family planning and related services as full MFPP coverage, such as annual exams, birth control, and STI care.
- Patients can access coverage immediately at the point of care, ensuring patients do not delay or forego important care.

Family Planning PE promotes health center sustainability

- As safety-net healthcare providers see more uninsured patients due to H.R.1-related coverage losses, Family Planning PE allows health centers to immediately connect or reconnect folks to coverage and care, reducing uninsured rates and uncompensated care.

Family Planning PE is fiscally responsible for states

- Family Planning services are matched by the federal government at 90%. Services provided during the PE period receive the same generous federal match.
